### Am I Eligible to Apply?

- High school students in 2nd through 4th years of high school (regarding 4th-year students, only those in their first semester are eligible) who currently attend an Advantages-accredited institution, and are working on an ASI or co-branded school diploma.
- Students with a GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Students showing high academic integrity, pursuing leadership, providing service to others, and exhibiting high moral character.

\*Applicants are selected by the ASI Advisory Board based on their academic performance, and personal merit. Not all that apply are accepted into this elite program.
